At Kalamazoo in May we return to our customary number of three sessions, this time all scheduled for Thursday. The music session, "Topics in Machaut's Music," will feature Alice Clark, Virginia Newes and myself, discussing issues ranging from four-part texture in the chansons to the presence of patterns and of mystical influence in the motets. presenter will offer a short paper, and a lively discussion will follow. Topics to be considered here include Machaut's characterization of Espérance the *Remède* (Paul Rockwell) and the contradictory portrait of patronage in Machaut's *Fontaine amoureuse* and Froissart's *Prison amoureuse* (Deborah McGrady), along with presentations by Nicole Lassahn, Kristin Figg, and Barton himself. In addition to these *musica speculativa* offerings, Margaret Hasselman will chair a *musica practica* session, entitled "Teaching Machaut." How to present the *Remède* to undergraduates, the use of singing and speaking voices in this work, and perceptions of Machaut's music will be discussed, respectively, by Margaret, along with Janice Zinser and Mary Wolinski.

With eleven presenters across our three sessions and a wide array of subjects and approaches, Machauviana will be extremely well represented this year. I look forward to seeing you there!

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Minutes of the 1997 Business Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 12:40pm, May 9, 1997 by Anne Robertson, presiding.

Officers provisionally elected last year or appointed by the President and Vice President during the year were confirmed by unanimous vote of the membership:

Financial report:

Barbara Altmann, outgoing Executive Secretary, reported on the financial situation of the Society at the end of her term in this office.

Jean Harden, incoming Executive Secretary, reported on financial matters related to the transition from one Secretary to another. The membership heard that an account has been opened in the Society's name in PointBank in Denton, TX. Signatories to this account are Anne W. Robertson, of Chicago, IL, and Jean Harden, of Denton, TX. These arrangements were approved by unanimous vote of the membership. Kateri Carver-Akers reported on the success of her appeal to the membership for funds to bring Dominic Leo to this conference to present a paper.

Anne Robertson will be the contact person for the Society for all sessions.

This information will be conveyed by May 15, 1997, to the appropriate persons at the Medieval Institute.

It was proposed that the Society look into the possibility of offering a small award for research on Machaut.

This award would be offered no more often than once a year and would be named in honor of Sarah Jane Williams, the first president of this Society.

C. Valk said that the Medieval Institute might chip in something toward such an award, perhaps in the form of a cut in the rate for housing at the Kalamazoo Conference or some similar financial benefit connected with the Conference.

This award would be intended as incentive for future work, not a prize for work already finished.

Members discussed where such an award might be announced. Two possibilities are the AMS Newsletter and the Society's soon-to-be-established Web page.

It was moved by Elizabeth Aubrey, seconded and approved by the membership, that the details of offering such a prize will be investigated by the officers, who will present a proposal on this issue at next year's meeting.

It was proposed that the Society establish a presence on the World Wide Web. Cynthia Cyrus volunteered to serve as the editor of a Machaut Society Web page and outlined the contents of the Web site that she has envisioned. The membership approved the concept and, after discussion, voted to authorize Cynthia Cyrus to establish the Web site according to the outline presented in this meeting and in consultation with the officers.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:25pm.

EDITION/TRANSLATION OF THE *VOIR DIT* IS IN PRESS

The edition/translation of Machaut's *Voir Dit* prepared by Daniel Leech-Wilkinson and R. Barton Palmer is currently in the final stages of production at Garland Publishing and, it is promised, will be available at Kalamazoo. The book includes a long introduction in which the "truth" questions raised by the letters, lyrics, and poetic narrative are discussed in full. After completing this critical edition of the poem, Leech-Wilkinson and Palmer are completely convinced that the letters that form its structural base are in fact real; and that some of the lyrics were composed by Guillaume's female correspondent, whose oeuvre is hereby rescued from textual oblivion. The authors' conclusion, while still debatable, should provide new directions for work on the poem. Machaut's text is presented with minimal editorial interference (e.g. no punctuation) and the miniatures of MS 1584 (A), which is the base manuscript for the edition, are reproduced where they occur in that text. A full bibliography is included, as are discussions of the poet's life and the sources and influences of the *Voir Dit*.
